Monthly Summary for the Month of November, 2020

Important events for the Month of **November, 2020** are as follows:

(A) IMPORTANT POLICY DECISIONS:

i. NITI Aayog's Cabinet Note titled "Atmanirbhar Bharat- Strategies for Enhancing India's Manufacturing Capabilities and Enhancing Exports" was approved by the Cabinet on 11.11.2020 and it proposes a Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme for Pharmaceuticals among other sectors wherein PLI scheme for pharmaceuticals has been given an outlay of Rs 15000 crore. Department has circulated the Draft EFC Memorandum for inter-ministry consultation for the proposed PLI scheme for Pharmaceuticals.

ii. Guidelines for implementing the provisions of Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order for Medical Devices Sector

The policy of the Government of India is to encourage 'Make in India' and promote manufacturing and production of goods and services in India with a view to enhancing income and employment. In this direction, DPIIT has issued revised Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order, 2017 dated 16.09.2020 and accordingly, Department of Pharmaceuticals has issued the revised guidelines dated 09.11.2020 for implementing the provisions of the public procurement order relating to goods & services related to Medical Device Sector.

(B) MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS:

(i) A total of 215 applications were received under PLI scheme for API/KSM/DI and 28 applications were received under PLI Scheme for Medical devices.

(ii) The NPPA has fixed ceiling prices of 08 medicines during November, 2020 bringing the cumulative figure to 870 till November, 2020

(iii) Retail prices of 34 new medicines have been fixed during November, 2020 bringing cumulative figure to 1451 till November, 2020. Total overcharged amount received during November, 2020 is Rs. 127.73 Lakh.

(iv) Price Monitoring and Resource Unit (PMRU) was set up in Madhya Pradesh in November, 2020. Now, 17 PMRUs have been set up against the target of 18 by 2020-21.

(v) 80 Jan Aushadhi Kendras under Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP) were opened during **November, 2020** across the country.
