

Teva recalls Emcure-made drugs

New Delhi: Israeli drug-maker Teva is recalling nearly 39,000 bottles of three drugs manufactured by its Indian supplier Emcure Pharmaceuticals in the US market due to violation of manufacturing norms.

The recall includes anti-diabetic glyburide and metformin hydrochloride tablets, anti-inflammatory drug indomethacin in different strengths and hypertension drug methyldopa. According to information available on US Food and Drug Administration's (USFDA) website, Teva is recalling 2,532 bottles of glyburide and metformin hydrochloride tablets for deviations from Current Good Manufacturing Practice (CGMP). ¶¶
